Longue Vue House and Gardens, a National Historic Landmark, was the eight-acre estate and family home of 20th-century New Orleans philanthropists and civic leaders Edith and Edgar Stern. During their time at Longue Vue, the Sterns activated the estate in support of artists, education, and civil rights.

Today, Longue Vue is a historic museum, open to the public and including daily tours, rotating exhibits, and a museum store.

Inspired by our humanitarian and artistic legacy, Longue Vue's mission is to be a leader in the advancement of innovative thought, creative expression and life-long learning, and to engage our resources and exceptional setting to stimulate discussion and action on issues of social justice and community responsibility.
